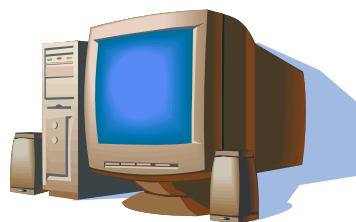
The whole search team is meeting again this week and the Trustees have asked us to try to select 3, or maybe 4, strong candidates.

## Fire squeeze close game

After the international break (!), CCC's football season continued yesterday at Petts Wood against a pacy Dulwich Fire team.

After a delayed kick off due to lack of nets, the game began at a fast pace, as our team struggled to cope with the speed that the Dulwich side had up front, and we needed goalkeeper Edward to stop us going a goal down.

However as the first half proceeded, we fought our way back into the match and we had our fair share of chances, but couldn't find the back of the net.

In the end it took something special (and a little bit fluky) to break the deadlock, an attempted cross from a Dulwich player ended up catching Edward unawares and sailing over his head into the bottom corner.

On the stroke of half time however we hit back, Eva scoring her second goal in two games so far this season, firing a powerful shot from the edge of the area.
