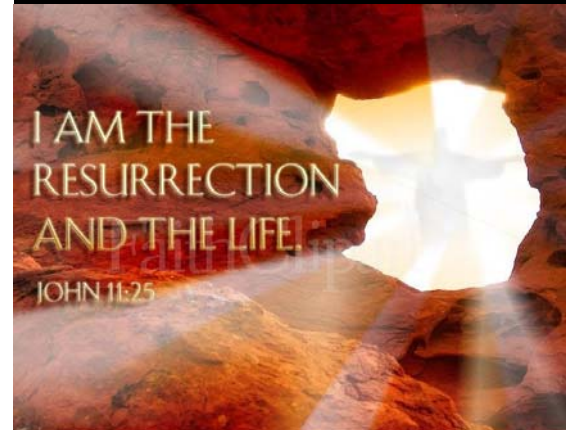

Did you see...?

... the first episode of **The Story of Jesus** on BBC1 on Friday? In this major two part series, nine of the world's leading Biblical experts re-examine the Gospel accounts of Jesus' life. Using the very latest archaeological, historical and theological research the programme analyses the key influences on Jesus' teaching, explores the land in which he lived and preached, and encounters the people who surrounded him.

Illustrated with specially-shot drama footage of the key moments in Jesus' life, aerial and time-lapse footage, these experts investigate the true meaning of the 2000-year old story of Jesus, and what it meant to his original first century followers.

Friday's episode investigated the story of Jesus from his birth to the beginning of his ministry, when he performed some of his famous healings and miracles.

The second episode, being broadcast this morning, follows Jesus from his controversial teaching in Galilee to the climax of his life in Jerusalem. The programme investigates the original revolutionary meaning of Jesus' teaching, and how the church has tried to downplay its real significance! And Tom Wright, former Bishop of Durham, investigates the historical truth of the resurrection and its part in Christianity's beginnings as a new religion.

Both episodes are available on the BBC iPlayer for the next week, if you haven't seen or recorded them.
