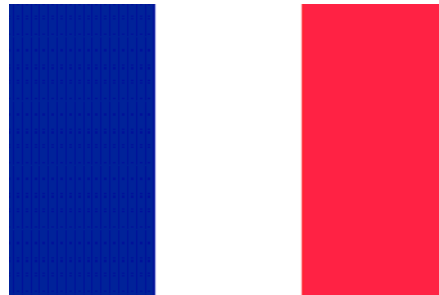


CCC@work and play

Catford's U11 footballers finished their season yesterday morning at Petts Wood, with 2 consecutive games against Elim, who we'd been unable to play earlier in the season.

So the season ended on a positive note, and departing players like Joel and Jordan were sent off to secondary school with a win.
