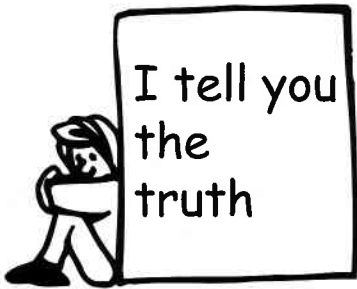
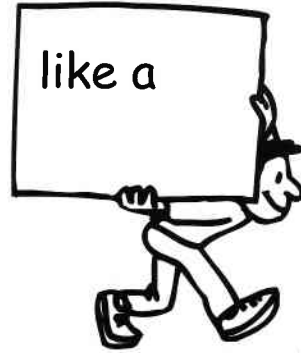




And Jesus went on to say... to find out what he says do the puzzle again... remembering the actions of the characters are giving you a clue to the order of the words...
